# Pattern Notes

Leg Pattern:

Round 1:

\*K1, p1, k1, p5\*

Round 2 and all even rounds:

repeat previous round.

Round 3:

K1, p1, \*k5, p1, k1, p1\*, end K5, p1

Round 5:

K1, \*p5, k1, p1, k1\*, end p5 k1, p1

Round 7:

\*K5, p1, k1, p1\*

Round 9:

P4, \*k1, p1, k1, p5\*, end (k1, p1) twice

Round 11:

K3 \*p1, k1, p1, k5\*, end p1, k1, p1, k2

Round 13:

P2, \*k1, p1, k1, p5\*, end k1, p1, k1, p3

Round 15:

K1, \*p1, k1, p1, k5\*, end p1, k1, p1, k4.

Round 16: Repeat round 15

Heel Flap:

Row 1 [RS]:

\*Slip stitch purlwise, k1\* across

Row 2 [WS]:

Slip first stitch purlwise, purl remaining stitches



## Supplies

2 skeins Manos Silk Blend

Set of five 3.5 mm (US 4) DPNs

Tapestry needle

A Gentleman's Gentleman

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# Directions

Cast on 48 stitches and divide across three needles.

Work cuff in either 1x1 rib or 2x2 rib for eight rounds.

The sock:

Work the pattern two times, and the first 8 rounds again, or until sock has reached desired length.

Heel:

Divide the sock evenly across two needles, 24 stitches per needle.

Work 24 rows of the heel flap

Turn Heel:

Row 1 [RS]: K15, ssk, k1, turn work.

Row 2 [WS]: Sl 1, p7, p2tog, p1, turn work.

Row 3 [RS]: Sl 1, k8, ssk, k1, turn work.

Row 4 [WS]: Sl 1, p9, p2tog, p1, turn work.

Row 5 [RS]: Sl 1, k10, ssk, k1, turn work.

Row 6 [WS]: Sl 1, p11, p2tog, p1, turn work.

Row 7 [RS]: Sl 1, k12, ssk, k1.

Row 8 [WS]: Sl 1, p13, p2tog, p1.

Row 9 [RS]: Sl1, knit to last two stitches, ssk.

Row 10 [WS]: Sl 1, purl to last two stitches, p2tog.  
14 stitches remain.

Gusset:

Knit all heel stitches; with same needle, pick up and knit 12 stitches along the side of the heel flap. This needle is now known as Needle 1.

K 24 held stitches onto one needle in the leg pattern. This needle is Needle 2.

Using a third needle, pick up and knit 12 stitches along the other edge of the heel flap, then knit the first 7 stitches from Needle 1. This needle is now



Needle 3.

Stitches are distributed as follows:

Needle 1: 19 stitches

Needle 2: 24 stitches

Needle 3: 19 stitches

Total: 62 stitches

Next Round: Knit to last 3 stitches on Needle 1, k2tog, k1; work all sts on Needle 2 in pattern as set; k1, ssk, knit to end of Needle 3. 60 stitches remain.

Next Round: K all stitches on Needles 1 and 3.  
Continue leg pattern on Needle 2.

Repeat these 2 rounds 6 times more. 48 stitches remain; 12 stitches each on Needles 1 and 3, 24 stitches on Needle 2.

Continue to work in pattern until sock is 2" shorter than desired length

Toe:

Next round:

Needle 1: Knit to last three stitches, k2 tog, k1

Needle 2: K1, ssk, knit to last three stitches k2 tog, k1

Needle 3: K1, ssk, knit to end.

Next round: knit all

Repeat until only 16 stitches remain. Consolidate stitches to two needles.

Bind off using the three needle method.

Block if needed.
